THE APPLICATION of FORTRESS CREDIT CORP., FORTRESS CREDIT OPPORTUNITIES I LP, and FORTRESS CREDIT FUNDING II LP (collectively, "Fortress") for an Order pursuant to Rules 46 and 47 of the Rules of Court, s.47 of the Bankruptcy and Insolvency Act, R.S.C. 1985 c.B-3 (as amended)(the "BIA"), s.39 of the Law and Equity Act, R.S.B.C. 1996 c. 253 (as amended)(the "LEA"), s. 66 of the British Columbia Personal Property Security Act, R.S.B.C. 1996, c. 359 (the "BC PPSA"), s-s. 99(a) of the Business Corporations Act,

C-36 (the "CCAA"), and the inherent jurisdiction of this Court appointing **Grant Thornton Limited** ("**GTL**") as Interim Receiver, Receiver and Manager (in such capacity, the "Receiver") without security, of all of the assets, undertakings and properties of the Petitioners EGC Holdings Ltd., EGC Properties Ltd. and Frank Sisson's Silver Dollar Ltd. (the "Debtors") coming on for hearing this day at the Courthouse, 800 Smithe Street, Vancouver, British Columbia

AND ON READING the Notice of Motion dated June 23, 2009, the Affidavit #1 of Roger Burgon sworn June 23, 2009 including the consent of **GTL** to act as the Receiver, the Affidavit #1 of Jeff Slahor sworn June 16, 2009; AND ON HEARING Warren B. Milman, Counsel for Fortress, Christopher J. Ramsay, Counsel for the Petitioners, Peter J. Reardon, Counsel for the Monitor:

APPOINTMENT

- 1. THIS COURT ORDERS that pursuant to Rules 46 and 47 of the Rules of Court, s.47 of the BIA, s.39 of the LEA, s. 66 of the BC PPSA, s-s. 99(a) of the ABCA, s-s. 65(7) of the Alberta PPSA, the CCAA, and the inherent jurisdiction of this Court, GTL is hereby appointed Receiver, without security, of all of the Debtors' current and future assets, undertakings and properties of every nature and kind whatsoever, and wherever situate, including all proceeds thereof, and including the following:
 - Lands and premises municipally described as 1010-42 Avenue S.E., Calgary, Alberta, and legally described as:

PLAN 8368HA BLOCK 24 EXCEPTING THEREOUT ALL MINES AND MINERALS • Lands and premises municipally described as 4412-9 Street S.E., Calgary, Alberta, and legally described as:

PLAN 8121 HN
BLOCK 4
THE SOUTH 236.27 FEET
CONTAINING 0.421 HECTARES (1.04 ACRES) MORE OR LESS
EXCEPTING THEREOUT ALL MINES AND MINERALS

(collectively, the "Property"), with effect as of 3:01 a.m. on Thursday, June 25, 2009.

RECEIVER'S POWERS

- 2. THIS COURT ORDERS that the Receiver is hereby empowered and authorized, but not obligated, to act at once upon its appointment in respect of the Property and, without in any way limiting the generality of the foregoing, the Receiver is hereby expressly empowered and authorized to do any of the following upon appointment where the Receiver considers it necessary or desirable:
 - (a) take possession and control of the Property and any and all proceeds, receipts and disbursements arising out of or from the Property;
 - (b) receive, preserve, protect and maintain control of the Property, or any part or parts thereof, including, but not limited to, changing of locks and security codes, relocating of Property to safeguard it, engaging of independent security personnel, the taking of

physical inventories and placement of such insurance coverage as may be necessary or desirable;

- (c) manage, operate and carry on the business of the Debtors, including the powers to enter into any agreements, incur any obligations in the ordinary course of business, cease to carry on all or any part other business, or cease to perform any contracts of the Debtors;
- (d) engage consultants, appraisers, agents, experts, auditors, accountants, managers, counsel and such other persons from time to time and on whatever basis, including on a temporary basis, to assist with the exercise of the powers and duties conferred by this Order;
- (e) purchase or lease machinery, equipment, inventories, supplies, premises or other assets to continue the business of the Debtors or any part thereof;
- (f) receive and collect all monies and accounts now owed or hereafter owing to the Debtors and to exercise all remedies of the Debtors in collecting such monies, including, without limitation, to enforce any security held by the Debtors;
- (g) settle, extend or compromise any indebtedness owing to or by the Debtors;
- (h) execute, assign, issue and endorse documents of whatever nature in respect of any of the Property, whether in the Receiver's name or in the name and on behalf of the Debtors, for any purpose pursuant to this Order;

- (i) undertake environmental or workers' health and safety assessments of the Property and operations of the Debtors;
- defend all proceedings now pending or hereafter instituted with respect to the Debtors, the Property or the Receiver, and to settle or compromise any such proceedings. The authority hereby conveyed shall extend to such appeals or applications for judicial review in respect of any order or judgment pronounced in any such proceeding, provided that nothing in this Order shall authorize the Receiver to defend or settle the action(s) in which this Order is made unless otherwise directed by this Court;
- (k) market any or all of the Property, including advertising and soliciting offers in respect of the Property or any part or parts thereof and negotiating such terms and conditions of sale as the Receiver in its discretion may deem appropriate;
- (l) sell, convey, transfer, lease, assign or otherwise dispose of the Property or any part or parts thereof out of the ordinary course of business:
 - (i) without the approval of this Court in respect of any transaction not exceeding
 \$20,000, provided that the aggregate consideration for all such transactions does not exceed \$200,000; and
 - (ii) with the approval of this Court in respect of any transaction in which the purchase price or the aggregate purchase price exceeds the applicable amounts set out in the preceding clause,

and in each such case notice under subsection 59(10) of the BC PPSA or under subsection 60(8) of the Alberta PPSA shall not be required;

- (m) apply for any vesting order or other orders necessary to convey the Property or any part or parts thereof to a purchaser or purchasers thereof, free and clear of any liens or encumbrances affecting such Property;
- (n) report to, meet with and discuss with such affected Persons (as defined below) as the Receiver deems appropriate on all matters relating to the Property and the receivership, and to share information with such Persons, subject to such terms as to confidentiality as the Receiver deems advisable;
- (o) register a copy of this Order and any other Orders in respect of the Property against title to any of the Property notwithstanding the requirements of section 191(1) of the Land Titles Act, R.S.A. 2000 c. L-4;
- (p) apply for any permits, licences, approvals or permissions and any renewals thereof as may be required by any governmental authority for and on behalf of and, if considered necessary or appropriate by the Receiver, in the name of the Debtors;
- (q) enter into agreements with any Monitor or trustee in bankruptcy appointed in respect of the Debtors, including, without limitation, the ability to enter into occupation agreements for any Property owned or leased by the Debtors;
- (r) exercise any shareholder, partnership, joint venture or other rights which the Debtors may have;

- (s) on notice to any persons as may be required by law:
 - (i) file a proposal under Part III, Division I of the BIA;
 - (ii) make an assignment under s.49 of the BIA; or
 - (iii) take any permitted steps under the CCAA;
 on behalf of any of the Debtors and take all steps necessarily incidental thereto;
 and
- and in each case where the Receiver takes any such actions or steps, it shall be exclusively authorized and empowered to do so, to the exclusion of all other Persons (as defined below), including the Debtors, and without interference from any other Person.

DUTY TO PROVIDE ACCESS AND CO-OPERATION TO THE RECEIVER

3. THIS COURT ORDERS that (i) the Debtors, (ii) all of the Debtors' current and former directors, officers, employees, agents, accountants, legal counsel and shareholders, and all other persons acting on its instructions or behalf, and (iii) all other individuals, firms, corporations, governmental bodies or agencies, or other entities having notice of this Order (all of the foregoing, collectively, being "Persons" and each being a "Person") shall forthwith advise the Receiver of the existence of any Property in such Person's possession or control, shall grant immediate and continued access to such Property to the Receiver, and shall deliver all such Property (excluding Property subject to liens the validity of which is dependant on maintaining possession) to the Receiver upon the Receiver's request.

- 4. THIS COURT ORDERS that all Persons shall forthwith advise the Receiver of the existence of any books, documents, securities, contracts, orders, corporate and accounting records, and any other papers, records and information of any kind related to the business or affairs of the Debtors, and any computer programs, computer tapes, computer disks, or other data storage media containing any such information (the foregoing, collectively, the "Records") in that Person's possession or control, and shall provide to the Receiver or permit the Receiver to make, retain and take away copies thereof and grant to the Receiver unfettered access to and use of accounting, computer, software and physical facilities relating thereto, provided however that nothing in this paragraph 4 or in paragraph 5 of this Order shall require the delivery of Records, or the granting of access to Records, which may not be disclosed or provided to the Receiver due to the privilege attaching to solicitor-client communication or documents prepared in contemplation of litigation or due to statutory provisions prohibiting such disclosure.
- 5. THIS COURT ORDERS that if any Records are stored or otherwise contained on a computer or other electronic system of information storage, whether by an independent service provider or otherwise, all Persons in possession or control of such Records shall forthwith give unfettered access to Receiver for the purpose of allowing the Receiver to recover and fully copy all of the information contained therein whether by way of printing the information onto paper or making copies of computer disks or such other manner of retrieving and copying the information as the Receiver in its discretion deems expedient, and shall not alter, erase or destroy any Records without the prior written consent of the Receiver. Further, for the purposes of this paragraph, all Persons shall provide the Receiver with all such assistance in gaining immediate access to the information in the Records as the Receiver may in its discretion require including, without limitation, providing the Receiver

with instructions on the use of any computer or other system and providing the Receiver with any and all access codes, account names and account numbers that may be required to gain access to the information.

NO PROCEEDINGS AGAINST THE RECEIVER

6. THIS COURT ORDERS that no proceeding or enforcement process in any court or tribunal (each, a "Proceeding"), shall be commenced or continued against the Receiver except with the written consent of the Receiver or with leave of this Court.

NO BANKRUPTCY FILINGS BY DEBTORS

7. THIS COURT ORDERS that the Debtors are enjoined from commencing or proceeding with any proceeding under the CCAA, the BIA or the United States Bankruptcy Code except with the written consent of the Receiver or with leave of this Court. Fortress is hereby granted leave to submit a plan of arrangement for the approval of the creditors of one or more of the Debtors.

NO PROCEEDINGS AGAINST THE DEBTORS OR THE PROPERTY

8. THIS COURT ORDERS that no Proceeding against or in respect of the Debtors or the Property shall be commenced or continued except with the written consent of the Receiver or with leave of this Court and any and all Proceedings currently under way against or in respect of the Debtors or the Property are hereby stayed and suspended pending further Order of this Court, provided, however, that nothing in this Order shall prevent any Person from commencing a Proceeding regarding a claim that might otherwise become barred by statute or an existing agreement if such Proceeding is not commenced before the expiration of the stay provided by this paragraph.

NO EXERCISE OF RIGHTS OR REMEDIES

9. THIS COURT ORDERS that all rights and remedies (including, without limitation, set-off rights) against the Debtors, the Receiver, or affecting the Property, are hereby stayed and suspended except with the written consent of the Receiver or leave of this Court, provided however that nothing in this paragraph shall (i) empower the Receiver or the Debtors to carry on any business which the Debtors are not lawfully entitled to carry on, (ii) exempt the Receiver or the Debtors from compliance with statutory or regulatory provisions relating to health, safety or the environment, (iii) prevent the filing of any registration to preserve or perfect a security interest, or (iv) prevent the registration of a claim for lien.

NO INTERFERENCE WITH THE RECEIVER

10. THIS COURT ORDERS that no Person shall discontinue, fail to honour, alter, interfere with, repudiate, terminate or cease to perform any right, renewal right, contract, agreement, licence or permit in favour of or held by the Debtors, without written consent of the Receiver or leave of this Court. Nothing in this Order shall prohibit any party to an "eligible financial contract" (as defined in Section 65.1 of the BIA) with the Debtors from terminating such contract or exercising any rights of set-off, in accordance with its terms. Further, nothing in this Order shall prohibit the Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission from cancelling, suspending, imposing new conditions or varying existing conditions of any registration or any licence in relation to Evergreen Gaming Corporation, Frank Sisson's Silver Dollar Ltd. and Frank Sisson Silver Dollar Casino, or from substituting or adding the Receiver in any such licence or issuing any new licences to the Receiver, under the *Gaming and Liquor Act*, R.S.A. 2000, c. G-1 or the *Gaming and Liquor Regulation*, Alta. Reg. 143/96.

CONTINUATION OF SERVICES

11. THIS COURT ORDERS that all Persons having oral or written agreements with the Debtors or statutory or regulatory mandates for the supply of goods and/or services, including without limitation, all computer software, communication and other data services, centralized banking services, payroll services, insurance, transportation services, utility or other services of any kind to the Debtors are hereby restrained until further Order of this Court from discontinuing, altering, interfering with or terminating the supply of such goods or services as may be required by the Receiver, and that the Receiver shall be entitled to the continued use of the Debtors' current telephone numbers, facsimile numbers, internet addresses and domain names, provided in each case that the normal prices or charges for all such goods or services received after the date of this Order are paid by the Receiver as may be agreed upon by the supplier or service provider and the Receiver, or as may be ordered by this Court.

RECEIVER TO HOLD FUNDS

12. THIS COURT ORDERS that all funds, monies, cheques, instruments, and other forms of payments received or collected by the Receiver from and after the making of this Order from any source whatsoever including, without limitation, the sale or disposition of all or any of the Property and the collection of any accounts receivable in whole or in part, whether in existence on the date of this Order or hereafter coming into existence, may be deposited into one or more new accounts to be opened by the Receiver (the "Post-Receivership Accounts") or into such bank accounts as may currently exist and may be necessary, in the sole judgment of the Receiver, for monies collected or received by the Receiver (collectively with the Post-Receivership Accounts, if any, the "Receiver's Accounts"). The deposits or proceeds in the Debtors' bank accounts may be transferred to the

Receiver's Accounts. The Receiver, in its discretion, may maintain in place, or renew in the name of the Receiver all existing depository relationships between the Debtors and their banks or other financial institutions. The Receiver may obtain such tax or other certificates or approvals as are necessary so as to establish, maintain or renew such accounts. The monies standing to the credit of the Receiver's Accounts from time to time, net of any disbursements provided for herein, shall be held by the Receiver to be paid in accordance with the terms of this Order or any further order of this Court.

13. Proceeds from the sale of any of the Property pursuant to this Order shall stand in the place and stead of the Property sold and all liens, claims, encumbrances and other interests that were attached to the Property prior to its sale shall, to the extent that they are not paid from the sale proceeds or otherwise, upon the closing of the sale of the Property, cease to be attached to or encumber or otherwise form a lien or a claim against the Property and shall attach instead to the sale proceeds with the same validity, priority and in the same amounts, and subject to the same defences, that existed when the liens, claims, encumbrances and other interests attached to the Property.

EMPLOYEES

14. THIS COURT ORDERS that, subject to the right of employees to terminate their employment notwithstanding paragraph 11, all employees of the Debtors shall remain the employees of the Debtors until such time as the Receiver, on the Debtors' behalf, may terminate the employment of such employees. The Receiver shall be liable for any employee-related liabilities, including wages, severance pay, termination pay, vacation pay, and pension or benefit amounts relating to any employees that the Receiver may hire (but, for clarity, not of those persons who remain employees of the Debtor).

15. THIS COURT ORDERS that pursuant to Section 7(3)(c) of the *Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act*, S.C. 2000, c. 5 or Section 18(1)(o) of the *Personal Information Protection Act*, S.B.C. 2003, c. 63, the Receiver may disclose personal information of identifiable individuals to prospective purchasers or bidders for the Property and to their advisors, but only to the extent desirable or required to negotiate and attempt to complete one or more sales or dispositions of the Property (each, a "Sale"). Each prospective purchaser or bidder to whom such personal information is disclosed shall maintain and protect the privacy of such information and limit the use of such information to its evaluation of the Sale, and if it does not complete the Sale, shall return all such information to the Receiver, or in the alternative destroy all such information. The purchaser of any Property shall be entitled to continue to use the personal information provided to it, and related to the Property purchased, in a manner which is in all material respects identical to the prior use of such information by the Debtors, and shall return all other personal information to the Receiver, or ensure that all other personal information is destroyed.

LIMITATION ON ENVIRONMENTAL LIABILITIES

16. THIS COURT ORDERS that nothing in this Order shall require the Receiver to occupy or to take control, care, charge, possession or management (separately and/or collectively, "Possession") of any of the Property that might be environmentally contaminated, might be a pollutant or a contaminant, or might cause or contribute to a spill, discharge, release, or deposit of a substance contrary to any federal, provincial or other law relating to the protection, conservation, enhancement, remediation or rehabilitation of the environment or relating to the disposal of waste or other contamination including, without limitation, the *Canadian Environmental Protection Act*, 1999, S.C. 1999, c. 33, the *Fisheries Act*, R.S.C. 1985, c. F-14, the *Environmental Management Act*, R.S.B.C.

1996, c. 118 and the *Fish Protection Act*, S.B.C. 1997, c. 21 and regulations thereunder (collectively "Environmental Legislation"), provided however that nothing herein shall exempt the Receiver from any duty to report or make disclosure imposed by applicable Environmental Legislation. The Receiver shall not, as a result of this Order or anything done in pursuance of the Receiver's duties and powers under this Order, be construed to be in Possession of any of the Property within the meaning of any Environmental Legislation, unless the Receiver is actually in Possession.

LIMITATION ON THE RECEIVER'S LIABILITY

17. THIS COURT ORDERS that the Receiver shall incur no personal liability or obligation as a result of its appointment or the carrying out of the provisions of this Order, save and except for any gross negligence or wilful misconduct on its part. Nothing in this Order shall derogate from the protections afforded the Receiver by Section 14.06 of the BIA or by any other applicable legislation.

RECEIVER'S ACCOUNTS

18. THIS COURT ORDERS that any expenditure or liability which shall properly be made or incurred by the Receiver, including the fees of the Receiver and the fees and disbursements of its legal counsel, incurred at the standard rates and charges of the Receiver and its counsel, shall be allowed to it in passing its accounts and shall form a first charge (the "Receiver's Charge") on the Property in priority to all security interests, trusts, liens, charges and encumbrances, statutory or otherwise, in favour of any Person, other than the Administration Charge and the Directors Charge created by the Initial Order herein.

- 19. THIS COURT ORDERS that the Receiver and its legal counsel shall pass their accounts from time to time, and for this purpose the accounts of the Receiver and its legal counsel are hereby referred to a judge of the Supreme Court of British Columbia and may be heard on a summary basis.
- 20. THIS COURT ORDERS that prior to the passing of its accounts, the Receiver shall be at liberty from time to time to apply reasonable amounts, out of the monies in its hands, against its fees and disbursements, including legal fees and disbursements, incurred at the normal rates and charges of the Receiver or its counsel, and such amounts shall constitute advances against its remuneration and disbursements when and as approved by this Court.

FUNDING OF THE RECEIVERSHIP

21. THIS COURT ORDERS that the Receiver be at liberty and it is hereby empowered to borrow by way of a revolving credit or otherwise, such monies from time to time as it may consider necessary or desirable, provided that the outstanding principal amount of such borrowing does not exceed \$500,000 (or such greater amount as this Court may by further Order authorize) at any time, at such rate or rates of interest as the Receiver deems advisable for such period or periods of time as it may arrange, for the purpose of funding the exercise of the powers and duties conferred upon the Receiver by this Order, including interim expenditures. The whole of the Property shall be and is hereby charged by way of a fixed and specific charge (the "Receiver's Borrowings Charge") as security for the payment of the monies borrowed, together with interest and charges thereon, in priority to all security interests, trusts, liens, charges and encumbrances, statutory or otherwise, in favour of any Person, but subordinate in priority to the Administration Charge and the Directors Charge created by the Initial Order herein and the Receiver's Charge.

22. THIS COURT ORDERS that neither the Receiver's Borrowings Charge nor any other security granted by the Receiver in connection with its borrowings under this Order shall be enforced without leave of this Court.

23. THIS COURT ORDERS that the Receiver is at liberty and authorized to issue certificates substantially in the form annexed as Schedule "B" hereto (the "Receiver's Certificates") for any amount borrowed by it pursuant to this Order.

24. THIS COURT ORDERS that the monies from time to time borrowed by the Receiver pursuant to this Order or any further order of this Court and any and all Receiver's Certificates evidencing the same or any part thereof shall rank on a *pari passu* basis, unless otherwise agreed to by the holders of any prior issued Receiver's Certificates.

ALLOCATION

25. THIS COURT ORDERS that any interested party may apply to this Court on notice to any other party likely to be affected, for an order allocating the Receiver's Charge and Receiver's Borrowings Charge amongst the various assets comprising the Property.

GENERAL

- 26. THIS COURT ORDERS that the Receiver may from time to time apply to this Court for advice and directions in the discharge of its powers and duties hereunder.
- 27. THIS COURT ORDERS that nothing in this Order shall prevent the Receiver from acting as a trustee in bankruptcy of the Debtors.

- 28. THIS COURT REQUESTS the aid and recognition of any court, tribunal, regulatory or administrative body having jurisdiction, wherever located, to give effect to this Order and to assist the Receiver and its agents in carrying out the terms of this Order.
- 29. THIS COURT ORDERS that the Receiver be at liberty and is hereby authorized and empowered to apply to any court, tribunal or regulatory or administrative body, wherever located, for recognition of this Order and for assistance in carrying out the terms of this Order and all such courts, tribunals and regulatory and administrative bodies are hereby respectfully requested to make such orders and to provide such assistance to the Receiver, as an officer of this Court, as may be necessary or desirable to give effect to this Order or to assist the Receiver and its agents in carrying out the terms of this Order.
- 30. THIS COURT ORDERS that the Applicant shall have its costs of this motion, up to and including entry and service of this Order, as provided for by the terms of the Applicant's security or, if not so provided by the Applicant's security, then on a substantial indemnity basis to be paid by the Receiver from the Debtors' estate with such priority and at such time as this Court may determine.
- 31. THIS COURT ORDERS that any interested party may apply to this Court to vary or amend this Order on not less than two (2) clear business days' notice to the Receiver and to any other party likely to be affected by the order sought or upon such other notice, if any, as this Court may order.
