Affidavit of Kyle Lane

I, Kyle Lane, make oath/affirm and give evidence as follows:

1. I am Senior Director, Special Loans, Credit Risk Management for the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce ("CIBC"), the Applicant in this proceeding.
2. I have personal knowledge of the evidence sworn to /affirmed in this affidavit except where otherwise stated to be based on information and belief.
3. I state, in this affidavit, the source of any information that is not based on my own personal knowledge, and I state my belief of the source.
4. CIBC is a secured creditor of 3304051 Nova Scotia Limited, which carries on business under the name "Hefler Forest Products" ("Hefler"), the Respondent in this proceeding.
5. Hefler operated a saw mill and biomass power generation plant from lands at 230 Lucasville Road, Middle Sackville, Municipality of Halifax, Nova Scotia, PID 40014862 (the "Lands").
6. Hefler owes CIBC an aggregate amount of \$6,646,978.45 as of January 14, 2021 under the following credit facilities ("Credit Facilities"):
 - a. \$5,104,506.29 under a term loan facility, with interest at 3.7% and a per diem of \$516.76, plus accruing legal and professional costs;
 - b. \$1,535,509.62 under an operating line of credit, with interest at 3.7% and a per diem of \$158.93; and

- c. \$6,962.54 owing on a corporate Visa, with a maximum facility of \$10,000.00
7. The Credit Facilities are secured by various security instruments given to CIBC by Hefler, including:
 - a) A Letter of Agreement dated January 13, 2020;
 - b) A Commercial Collateral Mortgage on the Lands, dated March 30, 2017, registered at the Land Registration Office for Halifax County on April 5, 2017 as Document No. 110562692;
 - c) A Security Agreement dated March 30, 2017, granting a charge on all assets, including over a list of motor vehicles, registered under the NS PPSA on March 29, 2017 as registration number 27388917;
 - d) An Assignment of Contracts dated March 30, 2017, securing, inter alia, a Power Purchase Agreement, a COMFIT Approval and a Standard Small Generator Interconnection Agreement.
 8. CIBC estimates the assets under its security to have a value of \$3,500,000.00, leaving a balance of an unsecured claim of \$3,146,978.45, as at January 14, 2021.
 9. On January 22, 2021, this court appointed Deloitte Restructuring Inc. as interlocutory receiver of Hefler in court file number Hfx No. 503367, a copy of which order is attached as Exhibit "A" to this affidavit.
 10. I am advised by our solicitors Burchells LLP, and do verily believe that Maritime Pressureworks Limited has filed a Builders' Lien on the lands dated January 15, 2021 for the sum of \$154,113.32 for services provide on or before December 19, 2020.
 11. Hefler, within the six months next preceding the date of the filing of this application, has committed the following acts of bankruptcy:
 - a) it has ceased to meet its liabilities as they became due.
 12. Deloitte Restructuring Inc. with offices in Halifax, Nova Scotia, is a person qualified to act as trustee of the property of the said debtor, and has agreed to act as such

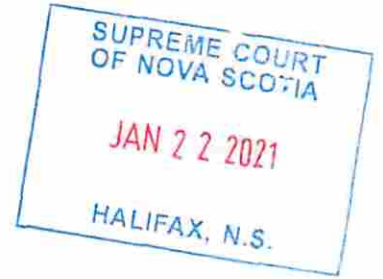

Interlocutory Receivership Order

Justice M. Heather Robertson

Before the Honourable Justice

in chambers

The Plaintiff filed a motion for an order, under subsection 243(1) of the *Bankruptcy and Insolvency Act* (the "BIA"), Section 77 of the Companies Act, R.S.N.S. 1989, c. 81, as amended, and Civil Procedure Rule 41, to appoint Deloitte Restructuring Inc. as interlocutory receiver (the "Receiver") without security, of certain of the assets, undertakings and properties of the Defendant acquired for, or used in relation to a business carried on by the Defendant.

The Plaintiff has provided proof of service by the affidavit of Kyle Lane ^{vee} sworn on January 18, ^{vee} 2021.

On motion of the Plaintiff, the following is ordered:

Service

1. The notice of this motion was served so that the motion is properly returnable today, any additional notice period is hereby abridged, and further service thereof is hereby dispensed with.

Appointment

2. The Receiver is hereby appointed interlocutory receiver, without security, of all of the assets, undertakings, and properties of the Defendant acquired for, or used in relation to a business carried on by the Defendant, including all proceeds thereof (the "Property"), other than a 2016 Volvo L90H held under security by VFS Canada Inc.

Receiver's Powers

3. The Receiver is hereby empowered and authorized, but not obligated, to act at once in respect of the Property and, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the Receiver is hereby empowered and authorized to do any of the following where the Receiver considers it necessary or desirable:
 - a. to take possession and control of the Property and any proceeds or receipts arising from the Property but, while the Receiver is in possession of any of the Property, the Receiver must preserve and protect it;
 - b. to change locks and security codes, relocate the Property to safeguard it, engage independent security personnel, take physical inventories, and place insurance coverage;
 - c. to manage, operate, and carry on the business of the Defendant, including the powers to enter into any agreements, incur and pay any obligations in the ordinary course of business, cease to carry on all or any part of the business, or cease to perform any contracts of the Defendant;

- d. to engage consultants, appraisers, agents, experts, auditors, accountants, managers, counsel, and such other persons from time to time and on whatever basis, including on a temporary basis, to assist with the exercise of the Receiver's powers and duties, including without limitation those conferred by this Order;
- e. to purchase or lease such machinery, equipment, inventories, supplies, premises, or other assets to continue the business of the Defendant, or any part or parts thereof;
- f. to receive and collect all monies and accounts now owed or hereafter owing to the Defendant and to exercise all remedies of the Defendant in collecting such monies, including, without limitation, to enforce any security held by the Defendant;
- g. to settle, extend, or compromise any indebtedness owing to the Defendant;
- h. to execute, assign, issue, and endorse documents of whatever nature in respect of any of the Property, whether in the Receiver's name or in the name and on behalf of the Defendant, for any purpose pursuant to this Order;
- i. to undertake environmental or workers' health and safety assessments of the Property and operations of the Defendant;
- j. to initiate, prosecute, and continue the prosecution of any proceedings and to defend proceedings now pending or hereafter instituted with respect to the Property or the Receiver, and to settle or compromise any such proceedings, which authority extends to appeals or applications for judicial review in respect of any order or judgment pronounced in any such proceeding;
- k. to make payment of any and all costs, expenses, and other amounts that the Receiver determines, in its sole discretion, are necessary or advisable to

preserve, protect, or maintain the Property, including, without limitation taxes, municipal taxes, insurance premiums, repair and maintenance costs, costs or charges related to security, management fees, and any costs and disbursements incurred by any manager appointed by the Receiver;

- l. to market any or all of the Property, including advertising and soliciting offers in respect of the Property or any part or parts thereof and negotiating such terms and conditions of sale as the Receiver in its discretion may deem appropriate;
 - m. to sell, convey, transfer, lease, or assign the Property or any part or parts thereof out of the ordinary course of business,
 - i. without the approval of this Court in respect of any transaction not exceeding \$100,000.00, provided that the aggregate consideration for all such transactions does not exceed \$250,000.00; and
 - ii. with the approval of this Court in respect of (a) any transaction involving real property or (b) in which the purchase price or the aggregate purchase price exceeds the applicable amount set out in the preceding clause;
- and in each such case notice under section 60 of the *Personal Property Security Act* shall not be required.
- n. Subject to court approval, to sell the right, title, interest, property, and demand of the Defendant in and to the Property at the time the Defendant granted a security interest or at any time since, free of all claims including the claims of subsequent encumbrancers bound as named Defendants, bound as parties joined as unnamed Defendants, or bound under Rule 35.12;
 - o. to report to, meet with, and discuss with such affected Persons (as defined below) as the Receiver deems appropriate on all matters relating to the Property and the receivership, and to share information, subject to such terms as to confidentiality as the Receiver deems advisable;

- p. to register a copy of this Order and any other orders in respect of the Property against title to any of the Property;
- q. to apply for any permits, licences, approvals, or permissions as may be required by any governmental authority and any renewals thereof for and on behalf of and, if thought desirable by the Receiver, in the name of the Defendant;
- r. to enter into agreements with any trustee in bankruptcy appointed in respect of the Defendant including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the ability to enter into occupation agreements for any property owned or leased by the Defendant;
- s. to exercise any shareholder, partnership, joint venture, or other rights which the Defendant may have; and
- t. to take any steps reasonably incidental to the exercise of these powers or the performance of any statutory obligations;

and in each case where the Receiver takes any such actions or steps it shall be authorized and empowered to do so, to the exclusion of all other Persons (as defined below), including the Defendant, and without interference from any other Person.

Duty to Provide Access and Co-Operation to the Receiver

- 4. The Defendant, all of its current and former directors, officers, employees, agents, accountants, legal counsel, and shareholders, and all other persons acting on its instructions or behalf, and all other individuals, firms, corporations, governmental bodies, or agencies, or other entities having notice of this Order (all of the foregoing, collectively, being "Persons" and each being a "Person") shall forthwith advise the Receiver of the existence of any Property in such Person's possession or control, shall grant immediate and continued access to the

Property to the Receiver, and shall deliver all such Property to the Receiver upon the Receiver's request.

5. All Persons shall forthwith advise the Receiver of the existence of any books, documents, securities, contracts, orders, corporate and accounting records, and any other papers, records, and information of any kind related to the business or affairs of the Defendant, and any computer programs, computer tapes, computer disks, or other data storage media containing any such information (the foregoing, collectively, the "Records") in that Person's possession or control, and shall, subject to their right to seek a variation of this Order, provide to the Receiver or permit the Receiver to make, retain, and take away copies thereof and grant to the Receiver unfettered access to and use of accounting, computer, software, and physical facilities relating thereto, provided however that nothing in this paragraph 5 or in paragraph 6 of this Order shall require the delivery of Records, or the granting of access to Records, which may not be disclosed or provided to the Receiver due to the privilege attaching to solicitor-client communication or due to statutory provisions prohibiting such disclosure.
6. If any Records are stored or otherwise contained on a computer or other electronic system of information storage, whether by independent service provider or otherwise, all Persons in possession or control of such Records shall, subject to their right to seek a variation of this Order, forthwith give unfettered access to the Receiver for the purpose of allowing the Receiver to recover and fully copy all of the information contained therein whether by way of printing the information onto paper, making copies of computer disks, or such other manner of retrieving and copying the information as the Receiver in its discretion deems expedient, and shall not alter, erase, or destroy any Records without the prior written consent of the Receiver. Further, for the purposes of this paragraph, all Persons shall provide the Receiver with all such assistance in gaining immediate access to the information in the Records as the Receiver may in its discretion require including providing the Receiver with instructions on the use of any

computer or other system and providing the Receiver with any and all access codes, account names, and account numbers that may be required to gain access to the information.

No Proceedings Against the Receiver

7. No proceeding or enforcement process in any court or tribunal (each, a "Proceeding"), shall be commenced or continued against the Receiver except with the written consent of the Receiver or with leave of this Court.

No Proceedings Against the Defendant or the Property

8. No Proceeding against or in respect of the Defendant or the Property shall be commenced or continued except with the written consent of the Receiver or with leave of this Court and any and all Proceedings currently under way against or in respect of the Defendant or the Property are hereby stayed and suspended pending further order of this Court.

No Exercise of Rights or Remedies

9. All rights and remedies of any individual, firm, corporation, governmental body or agency or any other entities against the Defendant, the Receiver, or affecting the Property, are hereby stayed and suspended except with the written consent of the Receiver or leave of this Court, provided however that this stay and suspension does not apply in respect of any "eligible financial contract" as defined in the BIA, and further provided that nothing in this paragraph shall (i) empower the Receiver or the Defendant to carry on any business which the Defendant is not lawfully entitled to carry on, (ii) exempt the Receiver or the Defendant from compliance with statutory or regulatory provisions relating to health, safety or the environment, (iii) prevent the filing of any registration to preserve or perfect a security interest, or (iv) prevent the registration of a claim for lien and the related filing of an action to preserve the right of a lien holder, provided that the Plaintiff shall not be required to file a defence to same as the

further prosecution of any such claim is stayed except with the written consent of the Plaintiff or the Receiver, or leave of this Court.

Personal Property Lessors

10. Other than with respect to a 2016 Volvo L90H held under security by VFS Canada Inc., all rights and remedies of any Person pursuant to any arrangement or agreement to which any of the Defendant is a party for the lease or other rental of personal property of any nature or kind are hereby restrained except with consent of the Receiver in writing or leave of this Court. The Receiver is authorized to return any Property which is subject to a lease from a third party to such Person on such terms and conditions as the Receiver, acting reasonably, considers appropriate and upon the Receiver being satisfied as to the registered interest of such Person in the applicable Property. The return of any item by the Receiver to a Person is without prejudice to the rights or claims of any other Person to the property returned or an interest therein.

No Interference with the Receiver

11. Subject to paragraph 16 of this Order related to the Defendant's employees, no Person shall discontinue, fail to honour, alter, interfere with, repudiate, terminate, or cease to perform any right, renewal right, contract, agreement, licence, or permit in favour of or held by the Defendant, without written consent of the Receiver or leave of this Court.

Continuation of Services

12. All Persons having oral or written agreements with the Defendant or statutory or regulatory mandates for the supply of goods or services, including without limitation, all computer software, communication and other data services, centralized banking services, payroll services, insurance, transportation services, utility, or other services to the Defendant are hereby restrained until further order of this Court from discontinuing, altering, interfering with, or terminating the

supply of such goods or services as may be required by the Receiver, and the Receiver shall be entitled to the continued use of the Defendant's current telephone numbers, facsimile numbers, internet addresses, and domain names, provided in each case that the normal prices or charges for all such goods or services received after the date of this Order are paid by the Receiver in accordance with normal payment practices of the Defendant or such other practices as may be agreed upon by the supplier or service provider and the Receiver, or as may be ordered by this Court.

13. The Receiver, in its sole discretion, may, but shall not be obligated to, establish accounts or payment on delivery arrangements with suppliers in its name on behalf of the Defendant for the supply of goods or services, including without limitation, all computer software, communication and other data services, centralized banking services, payroll services, insurance, transportation services, utility, or other services to the Defendant, or any of them, if the Receiver determines that the opening of such accounts is appropriate.
14. No creditor of the Defendant shall be under any obligation as a result this Order to advance or re-advance any monies or otherwise extend any credit to the Defendant.

Receiver to Hold Funds

15. All funds, monies, cheques, instruments, and other forms of payments received or collected by the Receiver from and after the making of this Order from any source whatsoever, including without limitation the sale of all or any of the Property and the collection of any accounts receivable in whole or in part, whether in existence on the date of this Order or hereafter coming into existence, shall be deposited into one or more new accounts to be opened by the Receiver (the "Post Receivership Accounts") and the monies standing to the credit of such Post Receivership Accounts from time to time, net of any disbursements provided

for herein, shall be held by the Receiver to be paid in accordance with the terms of this Order or any further order of this Court.

Employees

16. All employees of the Defendant shall remain the employees of the Defendant until such time as the Receiver, on the Defendant's behalf, may terminate the employment of such employees or they resign in accordance with their employment contract. The Receiver shall not be liable as a result of this Order for any employee-related liabilities, including any successor employer liabilities as provided for in subsection 14.06(1.2) of the BIA, wages, severance pay, termination pay, vacation pay, and pension or benefit amounts, other than such amounts as the Receiver may specifically agree in writing to pay, or in respect of its obligations under subsections 81.4(5) or 81.6(3) of the BIA or under the *Wage Earner Protection Program Act*, such amounts as may be determined by a court or tribunal of competent jurisdiction.
17. Pursuant to paragraph 7(3)(c) of the *Canada Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act*, the Receiver may disclose personal information of identifiable individuals to prospective purchasers or bidders for the Property and to their advisors, but only to the extent desirable or required to negotiate and attempt to complete one or more sales of the Property (each, a "Sale") as permitted at law. Each prospective purchaser or bidder to whom such personal information is disclosed shall maintain and protect the privacy of such information and limit the use of such information to its evaluation of the Sale, and if it does not complete a Sale, shall return all such information to the Receiver, or in the alternative destroy all such information. A prospective purchaser or bidder requesting the disclosure of personal information shall execute such documents to confirm the agreement of such Person to maintain the confidentiality of such information on terms acceptable to the Receiver. The purchaser of any Property shall be entitled to continue to use the personal information provided to it, and related to the Property purchased, in a manner which is in all material respects

identical to the prior use of such information by the Defendant, and shall return all other personal information to the Receiver, or ensure that all other personal information is destroyed.

Limitation on Environmental Liabilities

18. Nothing herein contained shall require or obligate the Receiver to occupy or to take control, care, charge, occupation, possession, or management (separately or collectively, "Possession") of any of the Property that might, or any part thereof, which may be environmentally contaminated, might be a pollutant or a contaminant, or might cause or contribute to a spill, discharge, release, or deposit of a substance contrary to any federal, provincial, or other legislation, statute, regulation or, rule of law or equity respecting the protection, conservation, enhancement, remediation, or rehabilitation of the environment or relating to the disposal of waste or other contamination including, without limitation, *Canadian Environmental Protection Act, 1999* or the *Nova Scotia Environment Act* (collectively, the "Environmental Legislation"), provided however that nothing herein shall exempt the Receiver from any duty to report or make disclosure imposed by applicable Environmental Legislation.

Limitation on Liability

19. Deloitte Restructuring Inc. and, without limitation, a director, officer, or employee of the Receiver, shall incur no liability or obligation as a result of its appointment as the Receiver or the carrying out the provisions of this Order, or in the case of any party acting as a director, officer, or employee of the Receiver so long as acting in such capacity, save and except for any negligence, breach of contract, or actionable misconduct on the part of such party, or in respect of the Receiver's obligations under subsections 81.4(5) and 81.6(3) of the BIA or under the *Wage Earner Protection Program Act*. Nothing in this Order shall derogate from the protections afforded the Receiver by section 14.06 of the BIA or by any other applicable legislation.

Receiver's Accounts

20. The Receiver and counsel to the Receiver shall be paid their reasonable fees and disbursements, in each case at their standard rates and charges, and the Receiver and counsel to the Receiver shall be entitled to and are hereby granted a charge to a maximum of \$100,000.00 (the "Administrative Charge") on the Property, as security for such fees and disbursements, both before and after the making of this Order in respect of these proceedings, and the Administrative Charge shall form a first charge on the Property in priority to all security interests, trusts, liens, charges, and encumbrances, statutory or otherwise, in favour of any Person, but subject to subsections 14.06(7), 81.4(4), and 81.6(2) of the BIA.
21. The Receiver and its legal counsel shall pass its accounts from time to time before a judge of this Court or a referee appointed by a judge.
22. Prior to the passing of its accounts, the Receiver shall be at liberty from time to time to apply reasonable amounts, out of the monies in its hands, against its fees, expenses and disbursements, including legal fees and disbursements, incurred at the normal rates and charges of the Receiver or its counsel, and such amounts shall constitute advances against its remuneration and disbursements when and as approved by this Court.

Receiver's Indemnity Charge

23. The Receiver shall be entitled to and is hereby granted a charge (the "Receiver's Indemnity Charge") to a maximum of \$100,000.00 upon all of the Property as security for all of the obligations incurred by the Receiver including obligations arising from or incident to the performance of its duties and functions under this Order under the *Bankruptcy and Insolvency Act*, or otherwise, saving only liability arising from negligence or actionable misconduct of the Receiver.
24. The Receiver's Indemnity Charge shall form a second charge on the Property in priority to all security interests, trusts, liens, charges, and encumbrances, statutory or otherwise, in favour of any Person, but subject to subsections

14.06(7), 81.4(4), and 81.6(2) of the BIA and subordinate in priority to the Administrative Charge.

Allocation of Costs

25. The Receiver shall file with the Court for its approval a report setting out the costs, fees, expenses, and liabilities of the Receiver giving rise to the Administrative Charge, the Receiver's Indemnity Charge, and the Receiver's Borrowings Charge, as defined below, and, unless the Court orders otherwise, all such costs, fees, expenses, and liabilities shall be paid in the following manner:
- a. Firstly, applying the costs incurred in the receivership proceedings specifically attributable to an individual asset or group of assets against the realizations from such asset or group of assets;
 - b. Secondly, applying the costs *pro rata* against all of the assets based on the net realization from such asset or group of assets; and
 - c. Thirdly, applying non-specific costs incurred in the receivership proceedings *pro rata* against the assets based on the net realization from such asset or group of assets.

Funding of the Receivership

26. The Receiver be at liberty and it is hereby empowered to borrow by way of a revolving credit or otherwise, such monies from time to time as it may consider necessary or desirable, provided that the outstanding principal amount does not exceed \$100,000.00, or such greater amount as this Court may by further order authorize, at any time, at such rate or rates of interest as it deems advisable for such period or periods of time as it may arrange, for the purpose of making payments, including interim payments, required or permitted to be made by this Order, including, without limitation, payments of amounts secured by the Administrative Charge and the Receiver's Indemnity Charge. The whole of the Property shall be and is hereby charged by way of a fixed and specific charge

(the "Receiver's Borrowings Charge") as security for the payment of the monies borrowed, together with interest and charges thereon, in priority to all security interests, trusts, liens, charges and encumbrances, statutory or otherwise, in favour of any Person, but subordinate in priority to the Receiver's Indemnity Charge, the Administrative Charge and the charges as set out in subsections 14.06(7), 81.4(4), and 81.6(2) of the BIA.

27. Neither the Receiver's Borrowings Charge nor any other security granted by the Receiver in connection with its borrowings under this Order shall be enforced without leave of this Court on seven days' notice to the Receiver and the Applicant.
28. The Receiver is at liberty and authorized to issue certificates substantially in the form annexed as Schedule "A" hereto (the "Receiver's Certificates") for any amount borrowed by it pursuant to this Order.
29. The monies from time to time borrowed by the Receiver pursuant to this Order or any further order of this Court and any and all Receiver's Certificates evidencing the same or any part thereof shall rank on a *pari passu* basis, unless otherwise agreed to by the holders of any prior issued Receiver's Certificates.

General

30. The Receiver may from time to time make a motion for advice and directions in the discharge of its powers and duties hereunder.
31. Nothing in this Order shall prevent the Receiver from acting as receiver of the Defendant or a trustee in bankruptcy of the Defendant.
32. The aid and recognition of any court, tribunal, or regulatory or administrative body having jurisdiction outside Nova Scotia is hereby requested to give effect to this Order and to assist the Receiver and its agents in carrying out the terms of this Order. All courts, tribunals, and regulatory or administrative bodies are hereby respectfully requested to make such orders and to provide such assistance to the

Receiver, as an officer of this Court, as may be necessary or desirable to give effect to this Order, to grant representative status to the Receiver in any foreign proceeding, or to assist the Receiver and its agents in carrying out the terms of this Order.

33. The Receiver is hereby authorized and empowered to apply to any court, tribunal, or regulatory or administrative body, wherever located, for the recognition of this Order and for assistance in carrying out the terms of this Order, and the Receiver is authorized and empowered to act as a representative in respect of the within proceedings for the purpose of having these proceedings recognized in a jurisdiction outside Canada.
34. The Plaintiff shall have its costs of this Application, up to and including entry and service of this Order, provided for by the terms of the Plaintiff's security or, if not so provided by the Plaintiff's security, then on a substantial indemnity basis to be paid by the Receiver from the Defendant's estate with such priority and at such time as this Court may determine.
35. Any interested party may make a motion to vary or amend this Order upon such notice required by the *Civil Procedure Rules* or on such notice as this Court may order.
36. Any Person affected by this Order which did not receive notice in advance of the hearing may make a motion to vary or amend this Order within five days of such Person being served with a copy of this Order.
37. In addition to the reports to be filed by the Receiver under legislation, the Receiver shall file a report of its activities with the Court when the Receiver determines that a report should be made, when the Court orders the filing of a report on the motion of an interested party or on the Court's own motion, and at the conclusion of the interlocutory receivership.

- 38. The Receiver shall not be discharged without notice to such secured creditors and other parties as the Court directs.
- 39. This interlocutory order shall remain in effect until an order is issued for the appointment of a receiver under Civil Procedure Rule 73 or as determined by further order of this Court.
