AFFIDAVIT OF ROBERT J. TAYLOR

Sworn on May 24, 2012

I, Robert J. Taylor, of the City of Calgary, Alberta, MAKE OATH AND SAY THAT:

- I am a senior vice-president of Ernst & Young Inc., and as such, I have personal knowledge of the facts and matters hereinafter deposed to, except where stated to be based on information and belief, in which case I verily believe the same to be true.
- 2. This affidavit is sworn in addition and with reference to the Affidavits previously filed in this proceeding.

- 3. Ernst & Young Inc. was appointed as an inspector pursuant to a resolution (the "Resolution") of unitholders of the Platinum Investment Trust ("PIT") for the general purpose of reviewing the operations of PIT and the activities of the PIT trustees and administrators (the "Inspector"). Attached and marked as Exhibit "A" is a true copy of the Resolution made effective March 1, 2012 and passed by approximately 64 percent of the PIT unitholders.
- 4. I understand that the Resolution was passed as a result of a number of unsuccessful attempts by PIT investors to get information from PIT, including through orders sought in these proceedings. A summary of the numerous Court Orders, as they relate to the provision and disclosure of Information, can be summarized as follows:
 - on July 27, 2011, the Court granted a consent order directing each of PIT, Shariff Chandran (the trustee of PIT), and Platinum Equity Inc. ("Platinum") to deliver information and documentation to Dupas in response to the original application ("Consent Order 1"). Attached and marked as Exhibit "B" is a true copy of Consent Order 1;
 - (b) on September 19, 2011, the Court granted an order directing that Chandran and Platinum comply with the terms of Consent Order 1 by September 22, 2011, and directed Chandran and Platinum to appear before the Court on September 26, 2011 to show cause why they should not be held in contempt of Court ("Order 2"). Attached and marked as Exhibit "C" is a true copy of Order 2;
 - on September 26, 2011, the Court granted a consent order finding Chandran and Platinum in contempt of Court for failing to comply with Consent Order 1 and Order 2, and directed that Chandran and Platinum appear before the Court on October 5, 2011 to show cause why a court officer should not be appointed to access and review the Information ("Order 3"). Attached and marked as Exhibit "D" is a true copy of Order 3;
 - on October 5, 2011, the Court granted an order appointing Grant Thornton LLP as Court officer ("Grant Thornton") for the purpose of, among other things, identifying, reviewing and reporting in relation to the Information ("Order 4"). Attached and marked as Exhibit "E" is a true copy of Order 4;

- (e) on October 20, 2012, the Court granted an order amending Order 4 to primarily deal with issues of privilege and relevance ("Consent Order 5"). Attached and marked as Exhibit "F" is a true copy of Order 5.
- As contemplated by the terms of Order 4 (as amended by Consent Order 5), Grant Thornton prepared a form of report dated November 7, 2011 outlining their activities as Court officer (the "GT Report"). Attached and marked as Exhibit "G" is a true copy of the GT Report.

THE RESOLUTION

- 6. The duties of the Inspector pursuant to the Resolution included, but were not limited to, investigating and reporting to Dupas and the Investors in regard to the following:
 - the funds raised and received by the trustees, or any of them, from Investors in connection with PIT, including funds raised through or from participants in any Platinum Mortgage Investment Corporation ("PMIC");
 - (b) any and all accounting, reconciliations or other information maintained by the trustees or PIT in respect of funds raised from Investors (the "Investors' Funds");
 - (c) any use made of Investors' Funds by the trustees of PIT from time to time, including without limitation the review and inspection of all bank accounts or other investments held by PIT at any time;
 - (d) whether the Investors' Funds are secured against any property of any description and, if so, the particulars of the security and the collateral:
 - (e) whether the Investors' Funds are or were at any time segregated and applied to specific investments, or were comingled;
 - (f) the identification and status of all assets and liabilities of PIT as they presently exist or have existed in the past from the inception of PIT to date;
 - (g) the identification and reconciliation of any redemptions or other dispositions of PIT property from time to time from the inception of PIT to date;

- (h) the identification and reconciliation of any redemption of units in PIT or other payments; and
- the identification and status of any construction with respect to any properties associated with PIT, including permits obtained, contracts entered into and monies owing;

(collectively, the "Inspector Duties").

- 7. In connection with the Inspector Duties, the Resolution also provided the following directions:
 - (a) all current and former trustees and all current and former employees of PIT were directed to produce to the Inspector all property, documents and information requested by the Inspector in the course of the Inspector's investigations;
 - (b) all current and former trustees and all current and former employees of PIT were directed to allow the Inspector access to any premises containing information relevant to the Inspector's investigations, and the Inspector was authorized to enter into any such premises;
 - (c) the Inspector was authorized to make copies of any hard copy or electronic record, document or other information relating to his investigations; and
 - (d) all third parties who are providing, or who have provided at any time, professional or other services to PIT were directed to cooperate fully with the Inspector. Any privilege associated with any professional or advisory services provided to PIT or to the trustees acting in that capacity at any time were waived for the purpose of the Inspector's investigation and his reporting to the unitholders.
- 8. I was personally involved with attempting to carry out the Inspector Duties pursuant to the Resolution.
- 9. When I attended PIT on March 27, 2012, I was advised by Chandran and Chitra Chandran that they were having difficulty locating all the relevant materials and further indicated the PIT accounting was incomplete.
- 10. I was able to review limited materials which included:

- (a) fragments of the loan portfolio held by PIT (the "Loan Portfolio");
- (b) some information regarding the status of loans;
- (c) some bank statements for intermittent periods;
- (d) some distribution statements;
- (e) some unitholder subscriptions;
- (f) a summary of the unitholders of PIT; and
- (g) the PIT minute book.
- 11. The materials that were made available to me were limited, incomplete and inadequate in order to perform the Inspector's Duties.
- 12. In an effort to advance the mandate of the Inspector, I prepared a memorandum dated April 2, 2012 addressed to Chandran outlining the materials that would be required to effectively complete the Inspector's mandate under the Resolution (the "Memorandum"). To date, despite several follow up inquiries, I have not received any reply. Attached and marked as Exhibit "H" is a true copy of the Memorandum.
- 13. The Inspector is not able to perform the Inspector's Duties as mandated by the Resolution as a result of the lack of response and cooperation from the trustee of PIT.
- 14. In addition, I further note that a summary was prepared, based on the limited information that I reviewed, of my current understanding of the Loan Portfolio (the "Loan Summary"). At the time the Loan Summary was completed, I was unable to confirm and/or summarize the loan payments that have been made to PIT, the amount of interest earned by PIT, the current outstanding balances of each loan, the expected recovery and timing of recovery in respect of the amounts owed to PIT, and the actions taken by PIT to protect its interest in the outstanding loans. Attached and marked as Exhibit "I" is a true copy of the Loan Summary.
- 15. My initial review and findings as Inspector leads me to believe that:
 - (a) much of the relevant Information is either missing or incomplete;

- (b) Chandran and Platinum are unlikely to reply to my memorandum or otherwise give me access to the Information;
- (c) the Investors' Funds are not properly accounted for and, in some cases, appear to be comingled; and
- (d) there is material credit risk in the value of PIT's loan portfolio, where amounts owed are not fully recoverable.
- 16. I reasonably believe that a fulsome review of the Information may reveal further "shortcomings" with respect to the apparent mismanagement of the Information and in the accounting of the Investors' Funds. I believe this is the reason why Chandran has not responded to my Memorandum.

ERNST & YOUNG INC. AS RECEIVER and MANAGER

- 17. Ernst & Young Inc. is prepared, subject to approval of this Honourable Court, to act as receiver and manager over the assets, undertakings and properties of PIT and Platinum (the "Receiver").
- 18. I do verily believe that:
 - (a) the historical disregard by Chandran and Platinum to Court Orders, the requests of Dupas, the Investors, Grant Thornton and the failure to respond to the Inspector's Memorandum for the provision of the Information is causing prejudice and irreparable harm to the Investors altogether;
 - (b) it appears that PIT is understaffed and that Chandran is unable or unwilling to effectively and appropriately administer all aspects of the operations of PIT for the benefit of the Investors including, but not limited to, indentifying and monitoring the status and realization strategy of each outstanding loan held in the Loan Portfolio;
 - (c) the assets of PIT need to be identified and require protection and preservation; and
 - (d) the appointment of the Receiver is just and convenient in the circumstances.

- 19. This Affidavit is sworn in support of an application for an Order from this Honourable Court:
 - (a) declaring that service of notice of this application and the supporting materials is validated and an Order abridging the time necessary for service of notice of this Application and/or any supporting materials, if necessary;
 - (b) appointing Ernst & Young Inc. as receiver and managers of the assets, undertakings and properties of PIT; and
 - (c) such further and other relief as this Honourable Court may deem just.

- 2. All Trustees past and present are directed to cooperate fully and completely with the Inspector in carrying out his duties.
- 3. All employees of the Trust are directed to cooperate fully and completely with the Inspector in carrying out his duties.
- 4. Without in any way limiting the Inspector in the discharge of his appointment generally, the Inspector shall investigate and report to the Unitholders the following:
 - (a) the funds raised and received by the Trustees, or any of them, from anyone ("Investors") in connection with the Trust, including funds raised through or from participants in any Platinum Mortgage Investment Corporation ("PMIC");
 - (b) any and all accounting, reconciliations or other information maintained by the Trustees or the Trust in respect of funds raised from Investors (the "Investors' Funds");
 - (c) any use made of Investors Funds by the Trustees or the Trust from time to time, including without limitation the review and inspection of all bank accounts or other investments held by the Trust at any time;

- (d) whether the Investors' Funds are secured against any property of any description and, if so, the particulars of the security and the collateral;
- (e) whether the Investors' Funds are or were at any time segregated and applied to specific investments, or were comingled;
- (f) the identification and status of all assets and liabilities of the Trust as they presently exist or have existed in the past from the inception of the Trust to date;

 - (b) all current and former Trustees and all current and former employees of the Trust are directed to allow the Inspector access to any premises containing information relevant to the Inspector's investigations, and the Inspector is hereby authorized to enter into any such premises;
 - (c) the Inspector is authorized to make copies of any hard copy or electronic record, document or other information relating to his investigations; and
 - (d) all third parties who are providing, or who have provided at any time, professional or other services to the Trust are hereby directed to cooperate fully with the Inspector. Any privilege associated with any professional or advisory services provided to the Trust or to the Trustees acting in that capacity at any time is hereby waived for the purpose of the Inspector's investigation and his reporting to the Unitholders.
- 6. Upon the conclusion of his investigation, the Inspector is directed to report his findings to the Unitholders, and may make interim reports to the Unitholders as he sees fit.
- 7. The fees, disbursements and costs of the Inspector and his employees and agents, including any legal fees he may incur in the discharge of his investigations, shall be paid promptly by the Trustees from Trust funds.

July 27, 2011 and the Order herein dated September 19, 2011; AND UPON hearing Counsel for the Applicant and the Respondents Platinum Equities Inc. and Shariff Chandran:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- 1. The Respondents, Shariff Chandran and Platinum Equities Inc., have failed to comply with paragraph 2(f) of the Consent Order of Justice Poelman dated July 27, 2011 and have not demonstrated any reasonable excuse for their failure. As a result, both Platinum Equities Inc. and Shariff Chandran are in contempt of this Court and are directed to take all steps necessary to purge that contempt.
- 2. The Respondents, Shariff Chandran and Platinum Equities Inc., are hereby directed to appear before the presiding Justice in Chambers on Wednesday, October 5, 2011 at 10:00 am to show cause why a Court officer should not be appointed to access and review the relevant information and provide it to the Applicants at the Respondents' cost, together with any other remedy that may be appropriate in the circumstances.
- 3. Platinum Equities Inc. and Shariff Chandran shall, jointly and severally, pay costs of \$2,000 to the Applicant in care of his counsel, forthwith and in any event of the cause. Dear Mr. Lindsay and Mr. Pelletier,

Further to the Consent Orders dated October 5, 2011 (the "October 5th Order") and October 20, 2011 (the October 20th Order) granted by the Honourable Justice Sulatycky regarding the above noted matter, and taking into consideration our letter dated October 27, 2011 and the letter dated November 1, 2011 from Mr. Pelletier of Barrington Barristers, we are pleased to provide our report.

Pursuant to the October 5th Order, members of Grant Thornton LLP arrived at the offices of Platinum Equities Inc. ("PE")/Platinum Investment Trust ("PIT") on October 6, 2011 at approximately 10:30 am. We were met by Chitra Chandran who provided us with a brief tour of the premises which was in disarray due to construction underway to renovate and downsize the offices. This disruption caused the books and records of PIT to be intermingled with PE and other related companies in boxes and file cabinets in two separate locations.

Ms. Chandran indicated that while she had seen the October 5th Order, she had not read it; therefore, we went through it in some detail to ensure that she had an understanding of what it said. Ms. Chandran provided us with the following information:

- Ms. Chandran, who is the sister of Shariff Chandran, is currently in charge of Investor Relations for PIT;
- We were informed that Shariff Chandran was in meetings and would not be available to meet with us;

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- Ms. Chandran indicated that she was the most senior person available and we could deal directly with her;
- Ms. Chandran stated that PIT is not currently being "run" by anyone nor did she know a lot about the company;
- Ms. Chandran indicated that most employees and contractors had recently been laid off and there was no accounting or computer staff who could assist us; and
- We discussed the records we wished to obtain copies of, including electronic records and
 Ms. Chandran seemed to think that most of the financial records were kept on paper but she
 did not appear to know what was kept or where any records were located.

Based on the foregoing, especially the apparent lack of knowledge by Ms. Chandran regarding the PIT business records and not having any other PIT or PE representative available to assist or direct us, we decided that the most efficient and effective approach to carry out the Consent Order would be to:

- Obtain copies, in electronic form, of hard copy documents in boxes and/or file folders described as related to PIT; and
- 2 Obtain electronic images of the PE/PIT server and other workstation computers.

We discussed the above with Ms. Chandran who raised no objection and directed us to the hard copy records and provided us with a key to the server room. Grant Thornton staff then began identifying and copying PIT records as described above, both hard copy and electronic, which took place over October 6, 7 and 11, 2011.

On the afternoon of October 6, 2011, counsel for the Applicant and counsel for the Respondent contacted Grant Thornton regarding two issues:

- Because Grant Thornton was obtaining an electronic image of the PE/PIT server, the information obtained would extend beyond that contemplated by the Consent Order (i.e. it would contain information regarding PE and other related and perhaps unrelated entities). It was agreed by all parties that we would proceed with the acquisition process but the data obtained from the server would be sealed and not reviewed or otherwise disclosed until our report had been provided to the Court; and
- Counsel for the Applicant had been advised by counsel for the Respondent that there were no records related to PIT at Mr. Chandran's personal residence or on his personal computer. This was consistent with the information we had received earlier from Ms Chandran. Therefore, while the Order contemplated a review of Mr. Chandran's personal residence, it was agreed by all parties that this was not necessary and would not take place at this time.



As described in the October 20th Order, we provided counsel for the Respondent with a CD of the scanned hard copy documents on October 19, 2011 and provided counsel for the Applicants and counsel for the Respondent with a protocol to review the imaged hard drives in our letter dated October 27, 2011.

In his letter dated November 1, 2011, counsel for the Respondent provided a detailed list of scanned hard copy documents which his client believed were irrelevant or privileged. We have removed these documents from the original set of documents and provided the remaining documents to counsel for the Applicant with a copy of this letter.

Also in his letter of November 1, 2011, counsel for the Respondent completely rejected our proposal to review the imaged hard drives described in our letter dated October 27, 2011. The letter goes on to request a new proposal suggesting that we avail ourselves of paragraph 3 of the October 5th Order and "seek the cooperation of Mr. Chandran and the employees of Platinum Equities Inc. in identifying the relevant documents on the imaged servers." While we are prepared to undertake such an exercise, we would like to point out that this was the approach we had intended to take when we first arrived at the premises of PE/PIT on October 6, 2011 but, as described above, were informed that Mr. Chandran was not available to us nor was there any employee of PE/PIT, other than Ms Chandran who had very limited knowledge of the company, who could assist us.

As agreed, we have also enclosed a statement of our account to date regarding this matter.

Platinum Investment Trust ("PIT") - Inspection of the Books and Records

As you are aware, I was appointed as inspector (the "Inspector") of PIT by the PIT Unitholders. The Inspector is to investigate and report to the Unitholders, on, among other things, the funds raised and received by the Trustees, all accounting, reconciliations and other information maintained by the Trustees, on the use of the investors' funds and whether the funds are secured against any

The PIT information and documentation made available to the Inspector last week was limited. We discussed that I would provide a memorandum to you setting out the additional information required with respect to the Inspector's investigation. In that regard, below is a summary of the information

- 1. Attached as Schedule "A" is a summary of what I understand to be the current outstanding loans entered into by PIT (either directly through funds raised in PIT or from PMIC I and PMIC II). With respect to Schedule "A" please provide or confirm the following with respect to each loan/mortgage as at March 31, 2012:
 - confirmation of the initial loan/mortgage amount;
 - confirmation of the mortgagee;
 - amount of interest earned or accrued. Please provide a spreadsheet setting out the interest;
 - amount of repayments received. Please provided specific details including copies of cheques received, deposit books, bank statements indicating the account to which the funds were deposited;
 - current outstanding loan balance;
 - amount of expected recovery and the timing of such recovery; and
 - confirmation of the status of the loans/mortgages including bankruptcy documents for those parties in bankruptcy, any listing agreements where the



properties are listed for sale and proposed next steps contemplated by your legal counsel.

- 2. PIT bank account statements, deposit books and cancelled cheques for all years that the bank account was maintained. I understand that the PIT bank account was closed; however, the date the account was closed was not provided to the Inspector. You provided the Inspector with the PIT bank statements for 2008 and 2009, but there were no deposit books or cancelled cheques provided. Moreover, the bank statement for September 2009 was not included in the folder of bank account statements that was provided.
- It appears that funds from various entities, PIT, Platinum Equities Inc., PIT General Partner Corp., PMIC I and PMIC II were comingled. Please provide the various bank statements, deposit books, cancelled cheques and accounting reconciliations detailing which entity received and disbursed the investors' funds.
- 4. A summary of all redemptions made to PIT Unitholders (and those PMIC I and PMIC II Unitholders that rolled their investments in PMIC I and PMIC II to PIT). Documentation is to include copies of cancelled cheques and bank account statements indicating the source of the funds and the quantum of the redemptions.
- 5. The detailed general ledger for the years ending December 31, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011 and to March 31, 2012.
- 6. Financial statements for PIT for the years ended December 31, 2008, 2009, 2010 and 2011.

As you will appreciate the Unitholders are anxious for the Inspector to conclude its mandate. Please arrange to have the aforementioned documentation available for the Inspector's review by April 9, 2012.
