- [5] **GIVEN** the Fifth Amended and Restated Initial Order rendered by the Court on March 27, 2023 (the "**Fifth ARIO**");

**THE COURT HEREBY:**


- [6] **GRANTS** the Application.

- [7] **EXTENDS** the Stay Period (as defined in the Fifth ARIO), solely in respect of FormerXBC Inc., until June 20, 2025, at 11:59 p.m. (Montreal time).

**GENERAL**

- [8] **DECLARES** that this Order and all other orders in these proceedings shall have full force and effect in all provinces and territories in Canada.
- [9] **REQUESTS** the aid and recognition of any Court, tribunal, regulatory or administrative body in any Province of Canada and any Canadian federal court or in the United States of America, including without limitation the United States Bankruptcy Court for the District of Delaware, and any court or administrative body elsewhere, to give effect to this Order and to assist the Petitioner, the Monitor and their respective agents in carrying out the terms of this Order.
