ENDORSEMENT

- [1] This matter concerns the ongoing insolvency proceedings involving JTI-Macdonald Corp. ("JTI"), Imperial Tobacco Canada Limited and Imperial Tobacco Company Limited (collectively, "Imperial") and Rothmans Benson & Hedges Inc. ("RBH"). This endorsement relates to all three Applicants.
- [2] Each of Deloitte Restructuring Inc., Monitor of JTI, FTI Consulting Canada Inc., Monitor of Imperial and Ernst & Young Inc., Monitor of RBH bring motions for a Banking Arrangements Order.
- [3] The motions proceeded without any opposition.
- [4] Among other things, the Banking Arrangements Order: (a) approves the engagement of BMO Trust Company ("BMO") to act as: (i) trustee of the Global Settlement Trusts; and (ii) bare trustee pursuant to the Supplemental Trust Agreements; (B) approves the fees and expenses of BMO; (c) approves the Trust Deeds; (d) approves the Supplemental Trust Agreements; (e) grants the Supplemental Trust Account Charges; and (f) approves the investment guidelines pertaining to the funds held in the Global Settlement Trusts.
- [5] The CCAA Plans relating to each of the Applicants were sanctioned on March 6, 2025, with reasons reported at 2025 ONSC 1358. Plan Implementation is expected to take place on August 29, 2025.
- [6] It appears that the requested relief is required prior to Plan Implementation.
- [7] Having reviewed the record and hearing submissions, I am satisfied that the requested relief is appropriate in the circumstances and is granted.
